Work of the RCPCH Child Protection Standing Committee

Below is a summary of some of the pieces of work that are currently being discussed and undertaken by the Committee:

- A decision has been made to have RCPCH member representatives with expertise in child protection on the Committee from each NHSE region, posts will be advertised.
- A range of work around Looked after Children is being carried in liaison with Coram BAAF and other partners.
- The RCPCH Peer review in Safeguarding guidance is being updated.
- Implementing the expert witness in the family court action plan.
- Following the publication of 'Rights to access healthcare for migrant and/or undocumented children, we are developing a position statement on charging for NHS healthcare
- Exploring the options for undertaking an audit against the Child Protection Service Delivery Standards.
- There is ongoing work on a number of publications, see section below for more details.
- Supporting work being carried out by RCPCH & Us to develop a checklist for young people and families around having a safe virtual health appointment.
- A working group will be reviewing the RCPCH mandatory reporting position statement.

RCPCH Conference 2021

The <u>RCPCH conference</u> is taking place online from 15th to 17th June. Places can be booked <u>here</u>. The Child Protection Special Interest Group have a joint session with the Paediatric Mental Health Association at 15.30 – 18.00 on Wednesday 16th June. Talks and research presentations will focus on the impact of COVID-19 on safeguarding and on mental health.

Child Protection Portal

Perplexing Presentations (PP) / FII guidance

This <u>updated guidance</u>, published in March, aims to support paediatricians when involved with PP or FII. It provides procedures for safeguarding children who present with PP or FII and best practice advice in the medical management of these cases to minimise harm to children. While

written primarily for paediatricians, it is also of relevance to social care workers, GPs and other health care specialists.

<u>Guidance around remote peer review in sexual abuse cases</u>

Guidance around the process for remote peer review in sexual abuse cases has been developed and included in the updated <u>FFLM/RCPCH peer review in sexual offences guidance</u>.

Capability framework for forensic medical examination services

There is work taking place led by Skills for Health in association with RCPCH, FFLM, RCN and others to develop a national capabilities framework for Forensic Examiners in England, undertaking paediatric forensic examinations. Please register your interests to be part of the consultation here.
